STATEMENT OF AGREEMENT REGARDING THE NEW CHILDREN'S CLINIC  
OF THE PORTLAND FREE DISPENSARY

UNIVERSITY OF OREGON MEDICAL SCHOOL, PEOPLE'S INSTITUTE AND FREE  
DISPENSARY, VISITING NURSE ASSOCIATION, AND OREGON TUBERCULOSIS  
ASSOCIATION, COOPERATING.

- Purpose:** For the examination and general health supervision of children who are either tuberculosis contacts or suspects, or who exhibit other signs of possible tubercular tendencies.
- Place:** This clinic will be held at the PORTLAND FREE DISPENSARY each  
**Time:** Saturday morning from nine to eleven a.m.
- Rent:**
- Equipment:** The Oregon Tuberculosis Association will pay \$25.00 per month toward the rent of the room and the necessary equipment will be provided by the Oregon Tuberculosis Association and the Portland Free Dispensary.
- Medical Service:** The faculty of the Medical School will furnish the Medical Service. The Dean of the Medical School has assigned Dr. Frank McCauley as Medical Director of this clinic, which has been made a junior elective for medical students. The assignment of cases for study by the Juniors will be made by the Supervisor of the Nursing Service of the Dispensary as per all other clinics.
- Nursing Service:** The Portland Free Dispensary, and the Portland Visiting Nurse Association will provide the nursing service. The relationship of the clinic to the Medical School and Portland Free Dispensary shall be similar to that of all other clinics held therein, subject to their general supervision with reference to schedule of students, staff appointments, and nursing administration.
- Registration:** To enable a standard procedure the patients will register in the Dispensary in the regular way through the Social Service and Registration Offices. Registration includes the registration fee and such other Dispensary fees as become necessary in the study of the case, always having in mind the patient's ability to pay.
- Records:** A special Case History will be used in addition to the regular clinical records. These case histories will be retained in special files available to the cooperating agencies, and the general clinical records will be held in the Dispensary files.
