
Dear Miss Prichard:

As you have no doubt been advised by Dr. Lucas, both the Eye and the Ear, Nose and Throat clinics will be closed on Monday, July 8. This being done by reason of the fact that patients from these clinics have been requested to appear at the hospital on Marquem Hill for the work of the examining boards. I believe Dr. Lucas has requested you to detail one of the registrars and one of the nurses to facilitate the handling of these patients at Multnomah Hospital, and I am sure that this request can be granted.

We are very anxious to secure the same measure of cooperation from the dispensary personnel in Portland as the national boards have hitherto received at similar examinations conducted in Philadelphia, New York, San Francisco, Minneapolis, and St. Louis. In most of these places the entire dispensary was closed for the day, and the entire staff placed at the disposal of the examining boards. We shall hope, through the cooperation of my distinguished colleagues on these boards, to have before long a fine new dispensary which, on subsequent occasions, we can use for this purpose.
