Dear Dr. Dillehunt:

I wish to acknowledge your letter of January 29th, in regard to the State Board of Health continuing its support to the Venereal disease clinic. It is quite desirable to secure better and more adequate quarters for this clinic. The Oregon State Board of Health started this clinic and has financed the same in order to provide a venereal disease clinic for indigents throughout the state.

At a number of meetings of the State Board of Health this clinic has come up for discussion. I think every member of the board is anxious to make it more efficient.

It will be necessary for me to refer this matter to the meeting of the State Board of Health, which I hope it will be possible for us to hold sometime in the near future, Dr Bean, the President of the board, is out of the city at the present time, and so I am unable to give you any exact date. I assure you, however, that we are very much interested in this clinic and sincerely hope that arrangements can be made for the building of an Outpatient department in connection with the University of Oregon Medical School.
